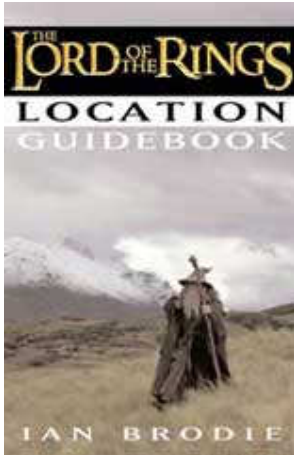


Lord of the Rings – Deer Park

the stunning Remarkables mountain ranges.
